Is the Grass Greener

Re-seed regularly to maximise feed efficiency and boost production from home grown forage.

With current poor milk and meat prices the temptation is to cut back or delay re-seeding and pasture improvement on the farm. However, it could be more costly overall to do this!

Well managed grassland provides the most economic feed source on the farm.

- ♦ Grass yields can halve within 7 years in a sward with the ingress of weed grasses for example, Perennial Ryegrasses can yield over 15t/h of DM, weed grasses like Annual Meadow only produce around 4t/h of DM.
- ♦ Sown grasses are: much higher feed value than weed grasses; higher in energy and protein; and higher digestibility.
- Higher digestible grasses lead to higher forage intakes.
- Response to Nitrogen Fertiliser is far more efficient with modern sown varieties than weed grasses.
- ♦ Perennial Rye Grass 100% efficient, Annual Meadow Grass 17% efficient.

The second Game & Countryside Conference was held at Cokethorpe School, Witney on Thursday 18 February. Over 120 gamekeepers, game farmers and individuals with game industry connections were in attendance.



There were five speakers this year: Charles Nodder opened with a fascinating insight into the changes in EU law on trapping stoats and the potential impact of Avian influenza. He was followed by Jamie Daniell who explained the Game Farmers' Association and the importance of membership.

Having been Minister of State for Agriculture, Sir Jim Paice spoke with great authority on the necessity of compliance with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. Then it was over to Dr Kenny Nutting, who talked about the role of medicines in game rearing.

The final speaker was Major General Jamie Balfour. Speaking of his experiences as a career soldier serving in Northern Ireland, Iraq and Afghanistan, Jamie described how he has adapted his forces expertise to run a successful private shoot.

The Conference ended with an interesting 'Question Time' chaired by David Hills, following which, he thanked everyone for attending a highly productive day.
